From the Pastor's Study...MAY 2021

A woman named Edna Butterfield writes about her husband, Ron. Ron is a special education teacher; he works with teenagers who are mentally challenged. For a lot of them, all of their lives they've been told that they can't do what other kids do. But Ron tries to get them to see that if they have faith... they can.

So, Ron (focusing on their abilities rather than their limitations) took them into the industrial arts room of the school. That's where the electric saws and power tools were. The kids had always been told they could not use electric saws and power tools. Ron gave them the faith to see that they could. First, he taught them how to restore furniture. Then he began teaching them how to repair home appliances: toasters, blenders, electric mixers... that sort of thing.

Ron says he knew that he'd succeeded in giving them faith in their abilities one morning when a student named Bobby walked into the room. In one hand Bobby was carrying a broken toaster... and in the other hand he was carrying a loaf of bread.

Ron asked him why he'd brought the bread along with the broken toaster.

Bobby smiled such a huge smile. He tried hard to form the words, and slowly he said, "Mr. Butterfield, if you say I can fix it, I can fix it! Just say the word!"

Young Bobby sounds an awful lot like the Roman Centurion that asked Jesus for a miracle in Luke's Gospel (7:1-10). Assigned to the Judean garrison, the Centurion must have carried out Caesar's orders to harshly tax the Jewish people. He knew that he had no right to ask anything of the Jewish Messiah.

But a servant whom he loved was deathly ill. And even though he was a Roman army officer and a Gentile, he had faith in the power of Christ. So, he sent friends to ask Jesus to heal his beloved bond-servant. The ancient historian Vestigius tells us that centurions were forbidden to marry. But it was a common practice for them to have unofficial wives; often one of their bond-servants. Any children they had would also be bond-servants. It is quite likely the sick man was the Centurion's son out of wedlock. We don't know for certain. What we <u>do</u> know is that the Centurion was humble. He knew that if Jesus, a faithful Jew, entered his house then He would be ritually defiled. So, hearing that Jesus was heading to his house, the Centurion sent his friends back to Jesus with another message.

"Lord, you don't have to bother coming here. I have faith that your word has power. Just say the word, and my servant will be healed."

Oh, Lord, let us echo the Centurion's prayer in our own lives. Say the Word, Lord, and your love will prevail in power.

Say the Word, Lord. Say it into the heart of that person lost in addictions or compulsions or needs that they can't seem to control, and your Word will have power to deliver them from their darkness.

Say the Word, Lord. Say it into a marriage where the only communication left is yelling and name calling and anger, and your Word will have power to restore their relationship.

Say the Word, Lord. Say it in the hospitals and the clinics, and no matter what sufferings we face... you will give us strength to endure.

And say the Word even in the funeral homes and the cemeteries, that if we close our eyes in death clinging to You in faith... we will most certainly open our eyes again into eternal life with You.

Say the Word, Lord into whatever situation we call to You from. Say it again and again in the world and in our hearts, because your Word has power.

Say the Word, Lord, and we will live...

After their homes are deemed unsafe or unhealthy, children are placed in our care by the court system and Department of Social Services in their home county. We serve children from birth through college age and beyond. Many of our children have been abused, abandoned, or neglected. Some may stay with us for only a few weeks, while others may spend a considerable part of their childhood in our care. In 2019, Black Mountain Home served more than 150 children from Western North Carolina."


